CONFIRM YOUR IMMIGRATION HEARINGS & APPOINTMENTS

 USCIS: all appointments and ceremonies have been <u>postponed or canceled</u> until at least June 4.

New notices should be sent to you or your representative.

• ICE Check-ins: In New York City, ICE has canceled inperson check-ins for the foreseeable future.

Other ICE offices may still have check-ins.

<u>Contact your local ICE office</u> to confirm your next checkin.

 Immigration Court: Many immigration hearings have been <u>postponed</u>, <u>but some</u> <u>are still happening</u>!

Currently, hearings for detained people are still happening.

Remember to attend all your hearings and appointments OR contact the appropriate agency if you cannot attend because you are sick!

PREPARE AND RESPOND TO ICE ARRESTS DURING COVID-19

ICE continues to arrest and detain immigrants!

They may come to a home early in the morning and often pretend to be local police officers doing an investigation. The officers might ask everyone in the home for their ID.

Remember: <u>You have rights!</u> <u>Learn how to protect</u> <u>your community!</u>

If your loved one is detained by ICE and is over 55 or has an underlying medical condition:

- Notify their ICE Deportation Officer and request their release.
- If your loved one has an attorney, the attorney can also contact ICE to demand that they be released or receive medical care.

GET THE HELP THAT YOU AND YOUR LOVED ONES NEED DURING COVID-19

- Receiving medical care will **NOT** affect your immigration situation or your immigration options in the future!
- According to ICE's policy, <u>ICE should not arrest</u> anyone inside of a healthcare location. <u>Know Your</u> <u>Rights</u> if ICE stops you on the street!
- Receiving the unemployment benefits that you deserve will **NOT** cause problems with immigration!
