"Earlier today ICE arrested a young man at Bronx Criminal Court who has no prior criminal record and was there to contest a misdemeanor charge. He is a DACA applicant and posed no threat to public safety. ICE's recent directive on courthouse enforcement suggested they would not target immigrants like him, yet they did so -- affirming that the agency will continue to stalk and arrest vulnerable immigrants and trample the Constitutional rights of those who participate in our judicial system. This is precisely why we are demanding that Chief Judge Janet DiFiore implement policies to keep ICE out of courts and protect all immigrant New Yorkers."
